The new facility will include:







Luther Park is more grateful than ever for the support of individual donors who have made special provisions for the camp's future.

Each year, Luther Park receives legacy gifts that donors make possible through their will and estate plans. A number of years ago, a woman by the name of Jessie Bonn left monies for Luther Park through her will because she wanted "every child to attend Bible camp." Luther Park's board of director's has established a policy that no one is turned away from attending camp just because of limited financial resources. A few years after that, Luther Park received a gift of real estate—a large donated house which they have worked to refurbish. The house, now referred to as the Welcome Center, serves as new staff offices, conference center and year-round retreat space.

Gifts of cash and stock, gifts of life insurance, gifts from IRAs, gifts of time and talents, and gifts-inkind like used vehicles and brand-new canoes are a huge blessing to the camp.

Donors have enjoyed supporting the camp because camp continues to be one of the few places where youth remain active after confirmation.

Bible camp is one of the reasons people in their 20s and 30s remain active in their faith life.

Dynamic college-age counselors ignite the faith of children and youth and are inspired in their own faith.

Year after year, stories are shared...stories about lives changed, youth connected, pastors called, lay people serving, counselors married, babies baptized, corporate churches enjoying fellowship and communion together in the body of Christ.

Camp works because it's a relational ministry.

Dave Rice receives 2014 Outstanding Christian Service Award

hen you ask Dave Rice why he likes to volunteer at Luther Park, you'll get a quick, short, clear and enthusiastic answer; "I just enjoy it!" And then he goes on to say, "I like the people, I like the food, I like helping out. I like the friendly greetings I always get. I just really enjoy being there." The only complaints he has are about the food. He joyfully says: "There's too much, and it's way too good!"



Rice first came up to camp about four years ago with a group from Mount Calvary in Excelsior for the Men's Ice-fishing Weekend (he even caught the biggest fish). "I fixed a few things and they asked me to come back," he added.

His volunteer involvements at Luther Park include helping with re-roofing of the Log House and five cabins, taking out and putting in docks and the pontoon lift, He has also worked on vehicles, plumbing under and in the cabins, cleared snow off the roofs, and many other tasks too numerous to mention here. He's even fixed the coffeemaker in the Lodge!

It's easy to tell that Rice is a man who likes to be busy...all the time. After retiring from working as a factory repairman on water heaters and boilers, he now spends his time working as a general handy-man for about 50 homes, as well as doing lots of volunteering.

Rice noted that his wife, Cindy's, life was saved twice about a year and a half ago. Out of thankfulness for the help they received from others he now volunteers whenever he can, including once each week at the Waconia Hospital.


He also enjoys summer fishing at his cabin on Little Sand lake with family and friends, as well as ice fishing with buddies on Lake Minnetonka in the winter. With a blended family of two daughters (his), two sons (her's), and five grandkids, there's no shortage of fishing partners.

Rice explained that growing up he never went to camp, and rarely went to church. His life now is a little different since he is at camp many weekends and remarked "I'm in church every Sunday now," Executive Director Joel Legred said, "Not long after he received the award, he was back up at camp again...roofing, taking in docks and boats and painting and wood splitting, and on, and on and on."

As it says on the plaque honoring his service, "Jack of all trades, master of all!

I'm guessing that a lot of us have built, helped build or repair a house or a building?
